Adam Hawks was the first of the name to come to America. He was born in England in 1608. Came to the Plymouth colony in Massachusetts in 1630, in Winthrop's fleet. This was in May 1630.

In August of same year a John Hawks came to the Jamestown colony in Virginia. Although he was probably a relative, we have no record of this Southern branch.

Adam Hawks married Annie Hutchinson, of Colonial history. They had two children, born in Charlestown in 1633, the record says, so they must have been twins. A boy, John and a girl, Susannah.

The Crockers.

They were from Berkshire County, Mass. Two brothers, Ezekiel and Oliver came to New York state about the year 1800, on foot, as there were no conveyances then. They settled at the junction of the Susquehanna and Chenango rivers, where Binghamton is now situated.

Ezekiel carried a little bag of apple seeds, and planted the first apple trees in that section. He was a soldier in the Revolutionary War, but served but a short time before its close. He was a lieutenant in Captain Amos Rathbone's Co of militia, in Major Caleb Hyde's detachment in Berkshire Co. Mass.

He married Lydia Arnold, first cousin of Benedict. Both he and his wife are buried in a grave yard near Binghamton I have visited the place, and made a memorandum from their tombstones.

At the same time I made a memorandum from another grave, of another Revolutionary Soldier, my mother's grandfather on her mother's side. Her mother was Mary Roe, daughter of Winthrop.

Winthrop Roe
Died May 1832
aged 84 yrs

I obtained the war record of Roe from the Pension Dept. at Washington D.C.

He was a private in the Connecticut Troops, under Capt. Tuttle and Col. Webb. Enlisted at Litchfield, Conn. Served one year. Was wounded, and when 40 years old applied for and obtained a pension.

I will record here, that the women descendants of Gov. Winthrop of the fleet ships of 1630, pledged themselves to name the first boy child born Winthrop, and to pass the rule down the line of daughters.

So, it is more than likely Great Grand-father Winthrop Roe was a descendant of Gov. Winthrop.

The Hawks family of today can claim a very good clean Colonial ancestry.

By an error of the orderly sergeant, the name Roe was enrolled as Rose. So he had to draw his pension under the enrolled name

Ezekiel Crocker owned quite a number
 of slaves, which he eventually set free. My
 mother was presented with a black boy
 of 18 years, as a marriage gift, but she did
 not accept, as she didn't want to bother with
 his training.

The Black Crockers never left their old
 home, and their descendants are still found
 in and near Binghamton.
